- What would we like in terms of people's understanding of staying and being safe when in a care home?

we replaced the word risk – what would we replace it with in order to promote a more positive perception around risk-taking?

- Whose permission do we find supportive when we are thinking about risk?
- How do we enable a culture of permission giving?

rules and regulations valued and actively promoted the place of risk as part of everyday life? What risks would staff be prepared to take?

we were getting 9 year olds who visit care homes to write and share articles about their experience and perceptions of care homes?

there were other ways to engage people around care homes e.g., care home cams, care home vlogs, care home Youtube channel? How would we like people to be talking about moving into a care home?

a person is moving into a care home next week, how would we like them and their relatives to feel and what would be in place that makes them feel this way? What expertise might there be in care homes that we have never thought about before?
